

Makaton Taster Course

Wednesday, N206, 2.10–3.10pm



This is the first of our three Makaton courses this term. Makaton is a unique spoken and non-verbal language programme that uses symbols, signs and speech to enable people to communicate. It supports the development of essential communication skills such as attention and listening, comprehension, memory, recall and organisation of language and expression.

Being able to communicate is one of the most important skills we need in life. Almost everything we do involves communication; everyday tasks such as learning at school, asking for food and drink, sorting out problems, making friends and having fun. These all rely on our ability to communicate with each other.

With Makaton, signs are used, with speech, in spoken word order. This helps provide extra clues about what someone is saying. Using signs can help people who have no speech or whose speech is unclear. Using symbols can help people who have limited speech and those who cannot, or prefer not to sign.

For those who have experienced the frustration of being unable to communicate meaningfully or effectively, Makaton really can help. Makaton takes away that frustration and enables individuals to connect with other people and the world around them. This opens up all kinds of possibilities.

This course will suit any student interested in being an inclusive school community including those wishing to work in caring and education professions.

The further two Makaton courses will be held on **24th November** and **1st December**.

Thinking of a career in Biological Sciences?

Wednesday 17th November, N206, 1.30–2.10pm



We are looking forward to welcoming back ex-student Shaun Wright who will talk about his career in biological sciences.

Shaun studied at Lymm High School between 2010 and 2017 and left Sixth Form with A' Levels in Biology, Chemistry and German. He graduated in 2021 following a 4-year course at the University of Manchester (Genetics with German) where he spent 2 years doing two different lab projects:

- He worked in Heidelberg, Germany, looking at circadian rhythmicity in Zebrafish models.
- He also worked on studying circadian rhythms in disorders of the skeletal system in Manchester.

Shaun has just started a Wellcome Trust PhD program (Immunomatrix in complex disease) at the University of Manchester where he will be studying mucus (much cooler than it sounds!).

Shaun is looking forward to talking to Lymm High students about what biology is like at degree level and the different pathways you can take if you study the degree.


