Live online LinkedIn profile building session

Thursday 19th May, 3.30pm

According to the Department for Education, 'English state schools put their students at a significant disadvantage because they do not appreciate the significance for their students of professional social platforms.' This virtual LinkedIn session will attempt to readdress this issue.

In 45 minutes, Year 12s and 13s will learn about how to set up a World Class LinkedIn profile from the experts.

What is LinkedIn?

LinkedIn is a social network like Instagram or Facebook but it is professional. It is where 75% of 17–24 year olds already get their jobs, apprenticeships, college places.

To get set up on LinkedIn, you first need to set up a profile. This on-line session, which is exclusive to students using the World Class App will introduce students to LinkedIn and show them how to build a World Class LinkedIn profile.

Young Darwin Scholarships 2022

Applications close on Sunday 5th June 2022

Applications are now open for this year's Young Darwin Scholarships. This is aimed at students aged 16–25 who are intrigued and fascinated by the natural world. Or who are thinking of pursuing an environmental career but don't know where to start. Now in its 10th year, this 5-day experience is immersed in the outdoors with ongoing support. In addition, 90% of the costs are covered by the Field Studies Council. Scholars will pay the remaining 10% (£45–£90 location dependent).

What is included in the scholarship?

The scholarship starts with a 5-day residential trip, or series of days, which involves a lot of time outdoors in environmentally-engaging locations. Students will:

- Practice a wide range of field and identification skills in areas which have been selected for their variety of plants, trees and wildlife.
- Gain practical observation, planning, and recording skills through a series of real-life application tasks.
- Explore a range of landscapes and learn how these areas are managed and conserved, guided by organisations such as the wildlife trusts and rangers.
- Meet inspirational speakers and experts from different environmental backgrounds to discuss current environmental issues and projects, offer advice and answer any questions.
- Build your confidence while exploring the outdoors with like-minded people, your own age who share similar interests.






Degree Apprenticeships from BT


