


Parliament Trip

London School of Economics Essay Competition

Deadline for submissions: Tuesday 10th October 2023

The London School of Economics' Undergraduate Political Review (LSEUPR) has an annual Essay Competition, which aims to encourage high school students to explore the field of Political Science and undertake university-style essay writing. It also presents itself as an ideal extra-curricular for students wishing to include this experience in their UCAS personal statements.

Students in Year 12 and 13 are invited to submit an essay in response to one of the following questions:

- "The management of Artificial Intelligence technology should be the biggest priority for the international community."
 To what extent do you agree?
- 2. "Democracies would be better off without political parties." Discuss.
- 3. Can International Organisations fight climate change effectively?

The essay should be no more than 1000 words, including all in-text citations, footnotes and headings but excluding title and bibliography. There are prizes

for first, second and third places.

This year's first place prize is a £100 Amazon Voucher, a certificate signed by Professor Paul Kelly, Head of the LSE Department of Government, the Essay published in the LSEUPR blog, and the opportunity to attend and to present the essay at the LSEUPR Annual Conference 2024.

Practical Ethics and Responsibility competition





To take part, teams of between three and five people should send a video of up to 4 minutes in length. There will then be a day of competitive debate in Oxford for the four top video teams on **Tuesday 19th March 2024**. 
