

Dissertation and thesis writing

On Friday, Year 13 will be looking at techniques for dissertation and thesis writing.

The <u>Academic Phrasebank</u> is a useful resource used by academic writers who need to report their research work. It was designed primarily for academic and scientific writers who are non-native speakers of English. However, students will find much of the material helpful. It aims to provide examples of some of the phraseological 'nuts and bolts' of writing organised according to the main sections of a research paper or dissertation. Other phrases are also listed under more general titles of academic writing. Both the phrases and the headings can help students think about the content and organisation of their own writing. Alternatively, the phrases can be incorporated into their writing where appropriate.

The items in the Academic Phrasebank are mostly content neutral and generic in nature. This means using any of the terms won't constitute plagiarism in any way.

Engineering Summer School

Every July, Swansea University runs a popular summer school designed for year 12 students who are thinking about applying to university. NHS Learning Support Fund

Applications open: Monday 2nd May

Students starting a course from 1 September 2020 onwards can apply for the NHS Learning Support Fund if they're on one of the following pre-registration undergraduate courses:

- dental therapy or dental hygiene (level 5 and 6 courses)
- dietetics
- midwifery
- nursing (adult, child, mental health, learning disability, joint nursing and social work)
- occupational therapy
- operating department practitioner (level 5 and 6 courses)
- orthoptics
- orthotics and prosthetics
- paramedics (DipHE and FD courses are not eligible for NHS LSF)
- physiotherapy
- podiatry or chiropody
- radiography (diagnostic and therapeutic)
- speech and language therapy

If eligible, you can get:

- a Training Grant of £5000 per academic year
- money back for excess travel and temporary accommodation costs (Travel and Dual Accommodation Expenses) while you're on your practice placement
- students experiencing financial hardship (Exceptional Support Fund)
