Year 12 Nuffield Research Placements

Deadline for applications: 28th February 2023



Applications are now open for the Nuffield Research Placement (NRP) programme. This gives Year 12 students the chance to take part in a real-life research project, with a host organisation, which provides an insight into the research work that goes on in academic or industry setting and helps them to explore what they might like to study at university or do as a career.

Interested students need to:

- check their eligibility using this online <u>Eligibility Tool</u>.
- be aware the programme provides research-related industry or academic experiences (not general work experience or ward-based medical experience).
- be available for at least three consecutive weeks during the school summer holiday between Year 12 and Year 13.

The Nuffield Research Placement programme gives Year 12 students the chance to take part in a real-life research project, with a host organisation from academia or industry. This gives you an insight into the research work that goes on in real-world settings and can help you to think about what you might like to study at university or do as a career.

Programme Overview

When? - During summer holidays after Year 12.

How long? – 4-6 weeks in total. This includes independent study ahead of 2-3 weeks for the real-world placement collaboration activities.

What? – A well-supervised but independent placement relating to an area of science, quantitative social science, computing, technology, engineering or maths - or a combination!

Cost? – You can take part in a placement at no cost. Travel costs are reimbursed and you may also be eligible to receive a £200 subsidy.

Where? – Placements take place in a variety of locations including offices, museums, research centres, laboratories or fieldwork settings.

Main Elements

- BeFutureReady Programme Approximately 10 hours of online modules covering professional, research, data and digital skills
- Research Project Placement Two or three weeks working on a summer placement provided by a university, company, or voluntary organisation
- Research Report and Poster Creation of report and poster to outline your research findings
- Celebration Event Display your poster and talk to other participants about their work

Eligibility Criteria

To apply, you must meet **ALL** of the following eligibility criteria:

- You must be over 16 and in Y12
- In full-time state-funded education.
- Studying one or more A Levels (or equivalent) in one of the sciences, technology, engineering, economics, geography, geology, social sciences (psychology, sociology etc) computing, statistics or maths
- Have at least 5 GCSEs at Grade 6 or above, including Maths, a Science and also English (or another Humanities subject)

You also need to meet **AT LEAST ONE** of the following eligibility criteria. You must either:

- Come from a family with a combined household income of below £30,000 a year (pre-tax)
- Or be entitled to free school meals, either now or at any time in the last six years
- Or be living, or have lived, in local authority care
- Or be entitled to receive discretionary payments at school or college, such as the EMA or 16-19 bursary
- Or be the first in your immediate family to participate in higher education (Parents/carers must not have completed university-level qualifications)





WELLBEING

Male mental health

Thursday 24th November, 7.30–8.45pm



This month, the youth mental health charity stem4 is focusing on supporting the mental health of boys and young men.

Whilst there is a focus on building confidence and self-esteem in girls, boys can struggle with self-esteem too. Boys and young men often have to conform to gender stereotypes which set standards based on 'strength', both physical and emotional, as well as encourage competition and advantage. Boys and young men often express low self-esteem differently. Some may act out through challenging behaviours, whilst others may 'escape' into distraction behaviours or withdraw.

Parents and carers play an important role in identifying and supporting positive self-esteem and worth. This webinar on Thursday entitled *Building Self-esteem* and *Positive Body Image in Boys and Young Men* looks at:

- early warning signs of low self-esteem and self-worth
- identifying when eating issues might turn into eating disorders
- management of muscle dysmorphia
- practical ways in which parents and carers might engage with, and address some of, these concerns


