

Movember


Sixth Formers and staff are pleased to be raising funds and awareness for Movember during the month of November.

Makaton courses

We will be running three Makaton courses on **17th November**, **24th November** and **1st December** for 1 hour from 2.10–3.10pm. Rooming will be confirmed.

Makaton is a unique spoken and non-verbal language programme that uses symbols, signs and speech to enable people to communicate. It supports the development of essential communication skills such as attention and listening, comprehension, memory, recall, and organisation of language and expression.

Being able to communicate is one of the most important skills we need in life. Almost everything we do involves communication; everyday tasks such as learning at school, asking for food and drink, sorting out

problems, making friends and having fun. These all rely on our ability to communicate with each other.

With Makaton, signs are used, with speech, in spoken word order. This helps provide extra clues about what someone is saying. Using signs can help people who have no speech or whose speech is unclear.

Using symbols can help people who have limited speech and those who cannot, or prefer not to sign.

For those who have experienced the frustration of being unable to communicate meaningfully or effectively, Makaton really can help. Makaton takes away that frustration and enables individuals to connect with other people and the world around them. This opens up all kinds of possibilities.

This course will suit any student interested in being an inclusive school community including those wishing to work in caring and education professions in the future.



Life Programme



Year 12

Students are coming to the end of their first term of relationship and sex education in their Life Programme sessions. We have recapped the need for barrier contraception compared to hormonal contraception if you wish to protect from STIs.

We've had discussions about consent and its grey zones and about the importance of getting full consent in a sexual relationship. We've discussed the difficulties that can crop up in relationships and how to de-escalate conflicts and end relationships if necessary.

In half term two we will focus on mental health and personal safety with links to drugs, alcohol and tobacco.

Year 13

Year 13 have had an interesting term in Life Programme learning about a range of topics. We have looked at how to support others through mental health issues. We've looked at the history of the LGBTQIA+ movement and considered the impacts of homophobic bullying and how to be an ally. We finished the term considering the different political ideologies and what they stand for.

In half term two we will look at road safety, educating around identity and race, and how to be a global citizen.


