

Understanding how your memory works can make a huge difference in your ability to learn effectively. Instead of simply re-reading notes, try techniques like active recall, where you test yourself on the material, or spaced repetition, which involves reviewing information at strategic intervals to strengthen retention.

Mnemonics and visualisation can also help make complex ideas more memorable by associating them with vivid images or patterns.


Another powerful technique is dual coding: combining words with diagrams or mind maps to engage multiple parts of your brain.

Beyond study methods, don't underestimate the impact of sleep, nutrition, and hydration on memory.

A well-rested brain retains information far better than one running on caffeine and late-night cramming!

This week, experiment with different revision techniques and reflect on what works best for you, because the right strategy can make all the difference in your academic success.




