Circadian Rhythm lecture (and applying to Manchester)

Wednesday 8th February, N206, 2-3pm

We are lucky to have Shaun Wright from the University of Manchester join us next week to give a lecture on applying to Manchester University and also to talk about his PhD research on the biological system 'the Circadian Rhythm'. This talk is compulsory for Year 12 Biology students, but Year 13 students are welcome too. We also recommend joining if you are interested in applying to Manchester University in the future.

Circadian rhythms are 24-hour cycles that are part of the body's internal clock, running in the background to carry out essential functions and processes. One of the most important and well-known circadian rhythms is the sleep—wake cycle. Shaun will discuss the importance of the rhythm and his research into its function. Thursday 9th February, 8.30am


The Business Department has an exciting opportunity for its business students.

Apprenticeship Mock Assessment

Year 13 students took part in an Apprenticeship Mock Assessment run by Warrington and Cheshire Pledge. The event was held in Northwich and was designed to give students a real taste of a mock assessment to support their confidence to apply and be successful in securing an apprenticeship. It consisted of:

- Team Building Task Working in small groups with students from other schools, students were set a task to build a marble run while being assessed on their engagement, communication and teamwork skills by a panel of employers. Afterwards, they were given feedback on their performance.
- **Speed Interview** In front of a panel of employers, students answered strength and competency-based questions using the STAR technique to structure their responses.
- Preparing for a presentation In groups, students chose a topic and worked together to prepare a presentation. They researched their business idea, set marketing strategies, and discussed their target market.
- Presentation Students delivered their business idea, on stage, to a panel of employers. There were some fantastic ideas, delivered with confidence (and in some cases humour!). Employers gave the students feedback on their presentations, which were all very positive.

The students reported that the event had been enjoyable and helped increase their confidence. Josh said, "It was a really useful day and good to connect with employers".






