

- 3. How far is it to the moon?
- 4. In 2021, giant tortoises were seen hunting birds, which may be the return of a 'lost' interaction. What implications could such restored interactions have for rewilding projects and conservation efforts for other species?

The competition has a prize pool of £750. A prizegiving ceremony will be held in Cambridge in summer 2023.


